

Some years ago, there formed in the minds of several Waitara people, the idea of starting a golf.. club handy to the town. An area of land thought suitable fo this purpose was found at the end of Mouatt Street, Waitara Bast, and a rather formidable task of clearing 76 acres of lupin was......



..... undertaken by consent of an initial meeting in July 1951. The photographs on this page, give some idea of the undertaking. The land running along the sea coast, was by nature, sandy loam and the preservation of the top soil of considerable importance. A tractor equipped......







....with a scrub cutting attachment, was purchased in January 1952, and the work began in earnest. The lupin was out and allowed to rot, thus providing further rich soil. 6 short holes were played on in the 1953 season, and at that time a caravan was used as a club house. It is to...



.... the great credit of the members, who provided most, if not all labour on a purely voluntary basis. The many hours of work and sweat produced a nine hole course which was opened in June of ...



...1955. As further clearances were made and as more of the area was brought in, this nine hole course was extended, and the present nine holes have been played on since 1956. In the next year water to the greens was installed. It is to the great credit of the Waitara Jolf Club that.



.....from lupin, some of which stood to feet high, there has emerged a course catering for 30 members.




### WAITARA UNIT 2nd Field Ambulance
