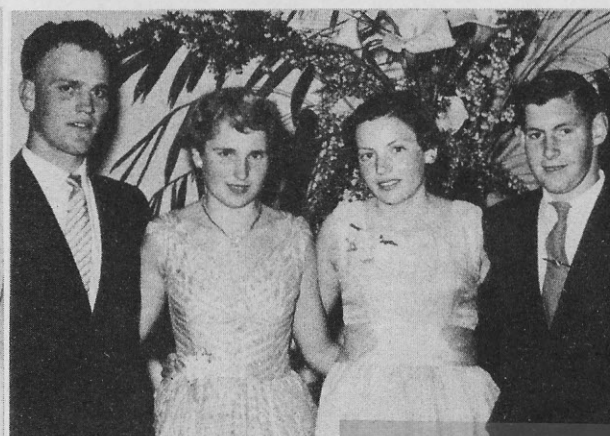

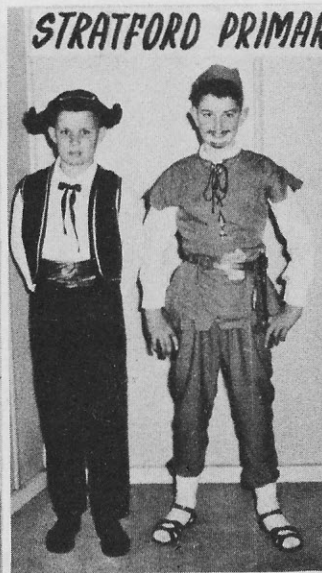

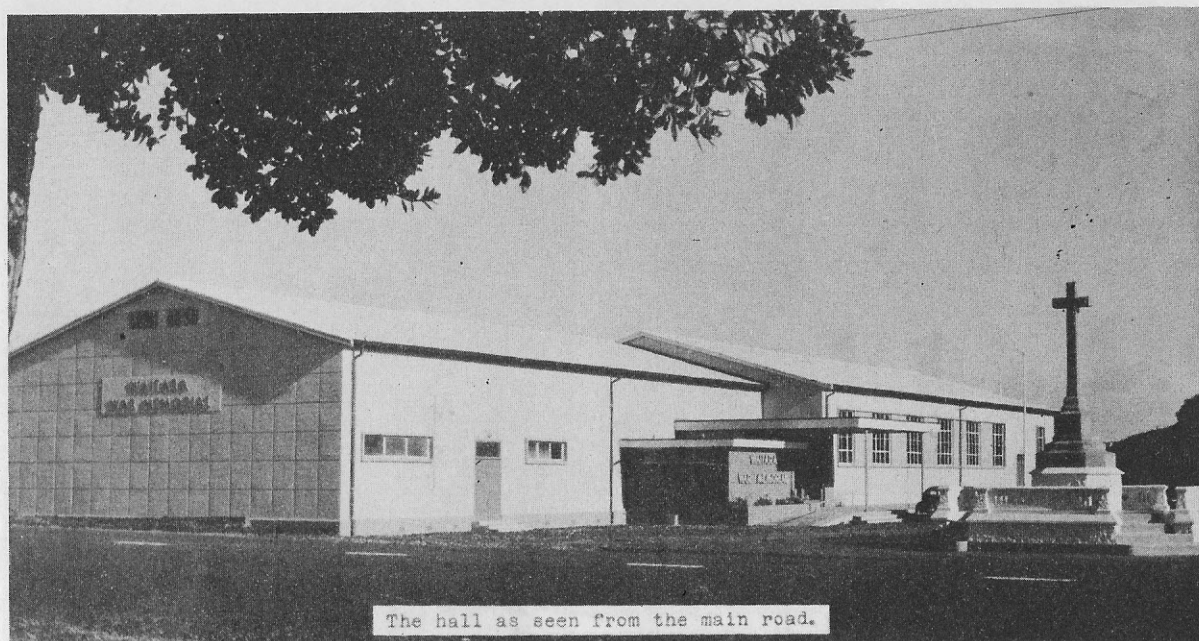

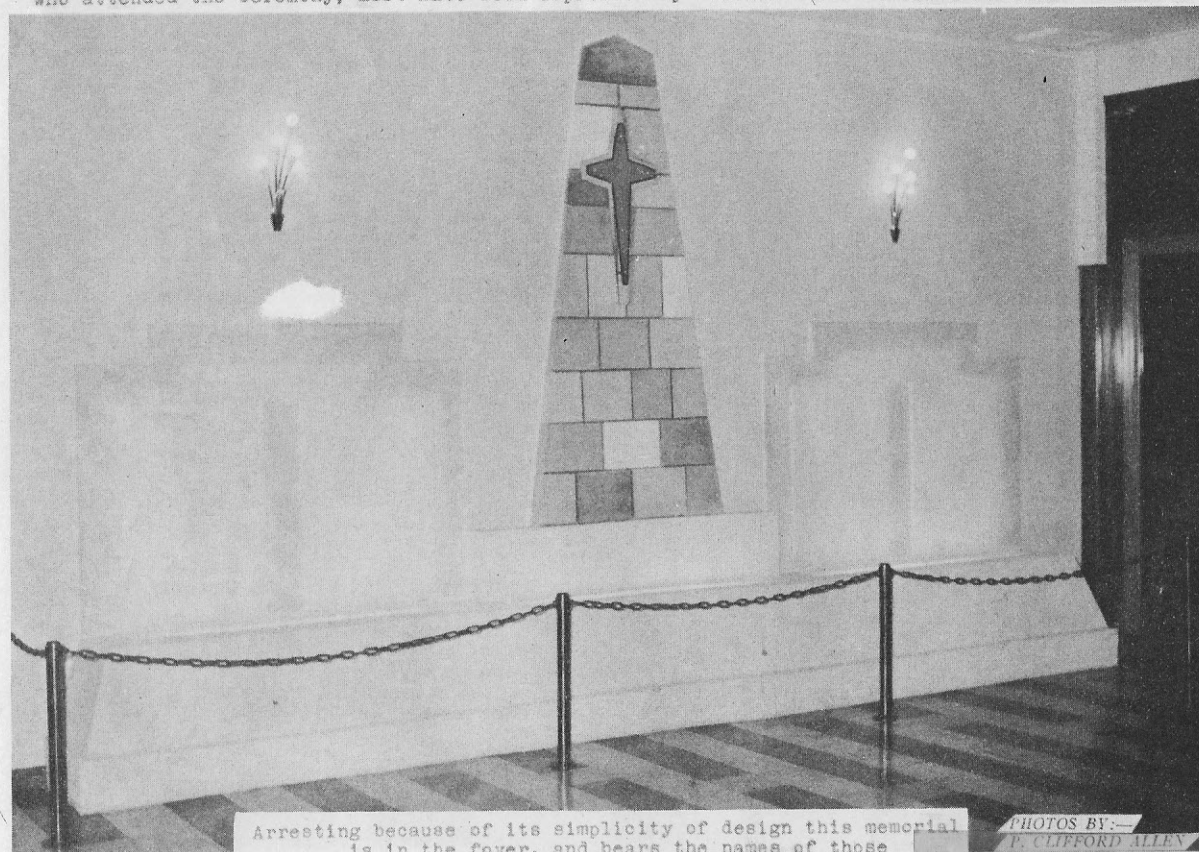


WAITARA'S BEAUTIFUL HALL

Waitara's War Memorial Centre, one of the three largest buildings in Waitara, is 230 feet long, with a width of 62 feet at the widest part and an overall height of 30 feet. The building, constructed at a cost of £45,000, £22,000 of which local residents subscribed, contains a games hall (above) measuring 106 feet by 60 feet, and a concert hall (below) 72 feet by 50 feet, a kitchen, canteen, cloakrooms, conveniences and showers, as well as a large foyer.

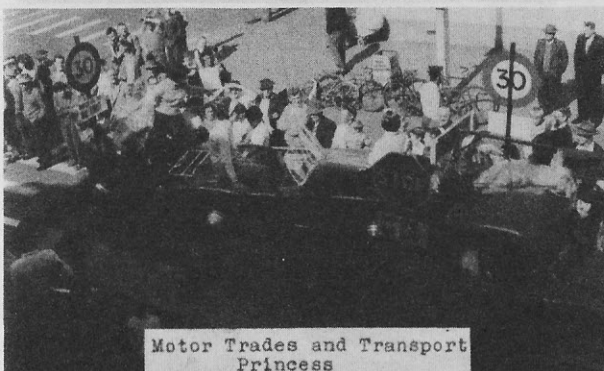

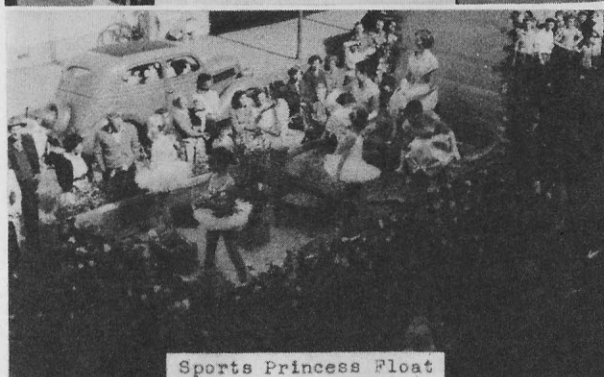

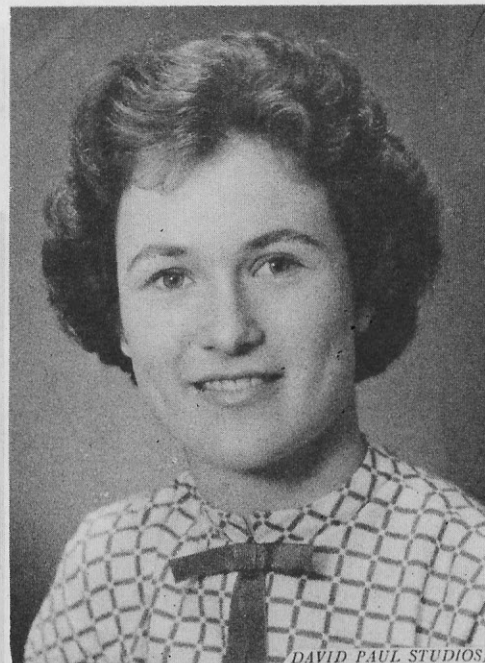

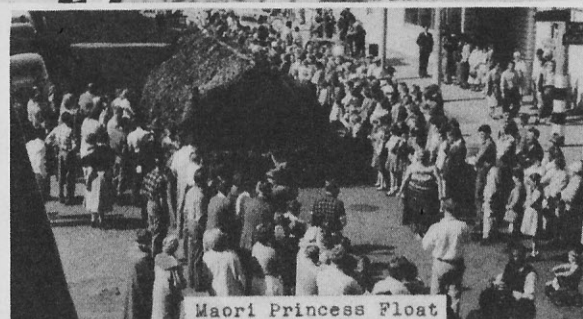

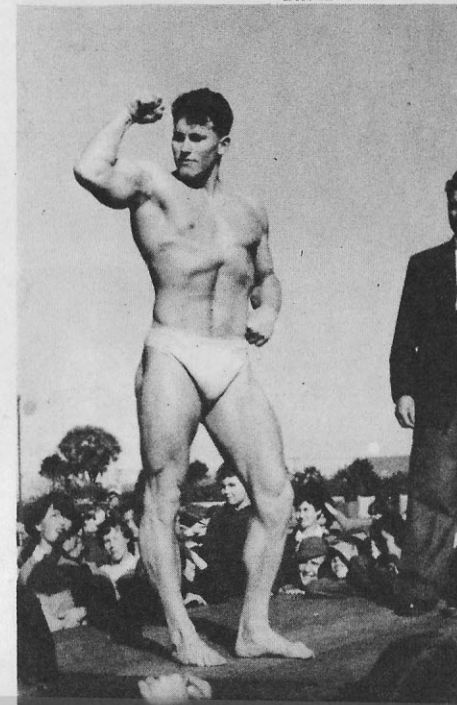

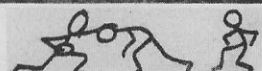

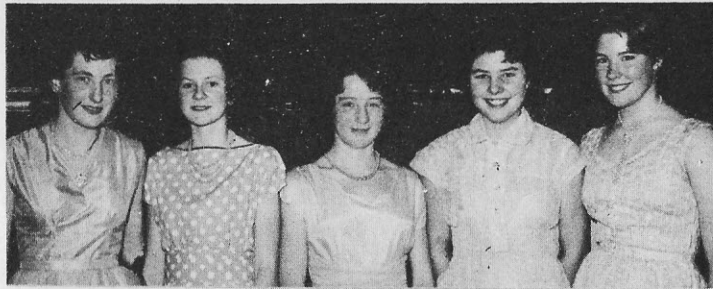

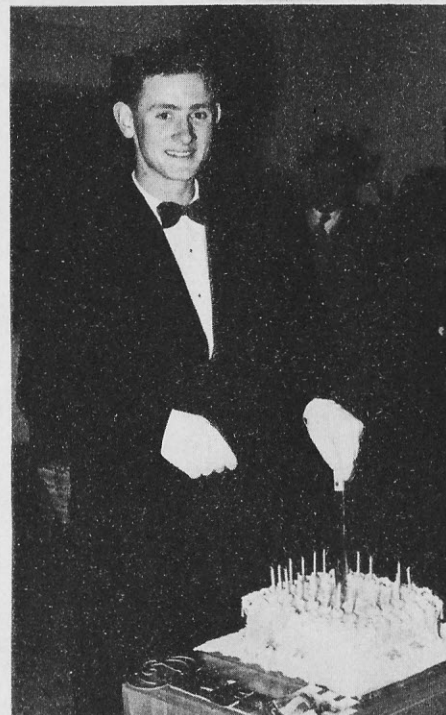
